

# STATE EVENT COMMITTEE

The State Event Committee has had a very active year, with meetings being conducted almost every month, some using ZOOM due to COVID restrictions.

As Chair of the Committee, comprising of fellow members, Wayne Lee, Karen Gatto, Sandy Wallace (Board member), Jackie Field and Bowls SA staff Matthew Northcott and Jessica Alvaro, we have been actively engaged in improving our State Events and the Conditions of Play associated with these events based upon feedback received from players, Regional State Event Managers and associations, alike.

Players had previously indicated their dislike for Champions Week, where often many months had passed before certain State Event disciplines reached their conclusion. In 2020/21, provisions were made to complete each State Event over a 3-4 week period.

Other measures/changes introduced for the 2020-21 season were:

- 1. No 3 vs 4 play-off for the Prestige Medley, with both Regions deemed equal third.
- 2. Prestige Medley Pairs reverted from 3x2 pairs to 2x2x2x2 pairs over 12 ends.
- 3. State Pairs and State Mixed Pairs reverted from 3x2 pairs to 2x2x2x2 pairs over 15 ends.
- 4. Increasing the time limit for State Events to 2.5 hours per round.
- 5. For State Events, Friday qualifying rounds were introduced for the metro region, in addition to the Sunday qualifying rounds.
- For State Events, country regions were able to conduct qualifying rounds at Association level, provided a minimum of four entrants applied, with the knock-out round being played at one venue within the region.
- 7. The final 16 and 8 round for State Pairs, State Mixed Pairs and State Singles were, for the first time, played in the regions Regions 8, 7 and 6, respectively.
- 8. Prize money for the 2020/21 State Events was increased and Men's and Women's prize money was equalised.
- 9. For country regions, only 50% of State Event entry fees was forwarded to Bowls SA, with the remainder being distributed to the Clubs hosting State Events within the region.

- **10**. All State Event entries were completed online using BowlsLink.
- **11.** Live streaming of State Event finals continued through the Bowls SA Facebook page.
- 12. Country Round Robin staggered starting times were introduced to alleviate COVID restrictions that were in place. In addition, a 3.5 hour time limit (for Men) and a 3 hour time limit (for Women) per round was implemented.
- 13. Adjustments were made to the Conditions of Play for the State U18 Championships. Also, losing semi-finalists in each discipline will be awarded equal third medals.
- **14.** State Event Entries; Country Carnival entries comparative numbers.

Looking forward to the 2021/22 season, the following measures have already been approved:

- 1. Introduction of State Over 60s Pairs, playing 2x2x2x2 pairs.
- 2. State Event entry fees will increase from \$14 per player to \$15 per player.
- 3. All State Events will be uniform for Men and Women.
- 4. Back-up days will be added to the end of each State Event, should the event be disrupted, rather than having the State Event resumed towards/ after the end of the 2021-2022 season.

The 2021/21 State Event calendar has been released and is on the Bowls SA website, while a review of the Conditions of Play in the State Event Tournament Book is in progress.

So, ends a very busy year for the State Event Committee.

## SENIORS COMMITTEE

The Senior Supa Series continued again in season 2020/21, with events conducted in the following regions;

- Copper Coast 3 Day Event Sept 2020 (27 entries)
- Naracoorte 2 Day Event Oct 2020 (19 entries)
- Marion BC 2 Day Event Jan 2021 (45 entries)
- Alexandrina 3 Day Event April 2021 (31 entries)
- Riverland 2 Day Event May 2021 (25 entries)

All events in the past season have been very well supported, especially the Metro event, which received a record 45 entries on both days.

The three-day Alexandrina event was the next most popular with 31 entries, while the Copper Coast event had 27 for its three days.

The two-day Riverland competition had 25 entries, while the two-day Naracoorte event had 19.

Special thanks must go to the regional Councils and host Clubs for their ongoing support of these great events across our State.

Planning for the next season is well under way and a complete 2021/22 schedule will be announced shortly.

### **COACHING & JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT**

2020/21 was a bit of a transition year. In March I took over from Isaac Trenorden in the position of Relationship Officer. Isaac had many programs that continued to succeed in the back end of 2020 and early 2021.

CoachZone was launched in September 2020, and after a steady start, it progressed into a fantastic resource for Clubs and their members. In the 10 months the program has been running, we have had our coaches visit and run over 102 individual or group sessions. We continue to develop these programs, and have incorporated not just skill sessions, but also presentations from our coaches to Clubs as a whole.

Pleasingly, we have been able to run a greatly successful High School Championships with 28 students from across South Australia competing. Congratulations to Corey Hicks on taking out that event. Late in 2020, the Primary School Championship was also run, with a great field on 27 in attendance.

By the numbers, SA currently has 274 accredited Club Coaches and 42 Introductory Coaches. Coaching Courses continue to be popular, with a lot of Clubs organising their own groups for us to deliver at clubs. We hope to continue

these courses in the off season and beyond, so please get in contact if you are interested in the future.

I look forward to continuing my work over the coming 12 months and meeting many of you, so if you get the chance, come and say hello and have a chat. The more I hear from you the better it is for our future programs and the future of our sport. With many new ideas, and helping improve current initiatives, I hope to see us continue to grow our sport.



We also took the SA Super League to a broader audience, with matches being replayed on Channel 44 at multiple times during each week of the season.

The SA Super League also featured on NITV across the country on multiple occasions, with plenty of positive

feedback coming from the Eastern States.

We also took two rounds of the season on the road this year, giving the teams a chance to play at their home clubs.

Planning is well under way for next season. The fourth edition of the SA Super League will be held across February and March 2022, with further details to come.

To finish I would like to thank the sponsors of the SA Super League for their fantastic ongoing support.

A big thank you to West End/Lion, ANZ, Sports Centre and the City of Salisbury.

Thank you very much one and all and we hope to see you out and about supporting the next season when in February/March 2022.

Stay tuned regarding the upcoming season, because there are some very exciting plans being put in place to take the SA Super League to a whole new level.

## **BOWLS AUSTRALIA REPORT**



### JAMES WILSON, BA PARTICIPATION AND PROGRAMS MANAGER - SA



I have now completed my second year in the role of Participation and Programs Manager - South Australia. The purpose of the role is to increase participation and membership within the sport of lawn bowls in SA, as well as to act as a conduit between Bowls Australia and Bowls SA. My key areas of responsibility include: junior participation, active ageing, social programs, club assistance, government relations and supporting events. I have mainly been working with clubs on participation programs, junior coaching, member recruitment and retention, social media, marketing and sponsorship/revenue diversification. Across the 2020/21 year, I have made 171 club visits, helping 127 individual clubs with varying areas of operation across each region of the state. One hugely successful area of support has been in the grants space, with over \$3 million being invested into our clubs across 2020/21.

We have had vast success across our participation programs this year, with promising uptake across the whole State. Roll Back the Clock boosts physical activity rates among Australians aged 65+ through activity for both the body and mind, while incorpo-

rating bowls, functional training, fitness and wellness, education and socialisation. The program offers a low-cost opportunity for older Australians to take part in accessible activities and provides opportunities for those socially isolated to engage with new people. Across the 2020/21 season, we have successfully delivered 22 programs across the likes of Holdfast Bay, McLaren Vale, Trinity Gardens, Kensington/Marryatville and Burra. The grant funding for this program has ceased as of the 30th June, however, there are plans in place to continue the program from August, with many councils looking to jointly fund the program with clubs and Bowls Australia.

We had Junior Jack Attack rebranded to become Rookie Rollers in January to better reflect the vast range of people that the modified equipment could support. The predominant focal point for Rookie Rollers is within the Sporting Schools program, allowing primary schools to offer lawn bowls as part of the curriculum. This year, 31 South Australian primary schools have included lawn bowls in their curriculum through the Sporting Schools program - the





overwhelming majority of these being in regional areas.

Finally, Jack Attack, which is a social bowls format comprising 2-bowl triples and played in 2 x 5 set ends based on the BPL format, has been hugely successful in South Australia this year. With only five clubs in 2019/20 licensed and no active programs, we have seen eight new clubs sign up to the program during the 2020/21 season to bring us to 13 clubs. Of these, three clubs ran programs across the summer in Murray Bridge RSL, Christies Beach and Langhorne Creek with huge success reported both financially and in terms of interest in the format and new membership. Three of the new clubs will be looking to run their first programs early in the 2021/22 season.

In addition to this involvement, I have been involved in event management and live streaming of various State Events such as Champion of Champion Pairs, Senior Supa Series, Super League, Country Carnival and the Women's Prestige Medley. Speaking of events, the BPL Cup has gone from strength to strength this year after the West Lakes boys won the National final in February. After a record-breaking year in 2020, 2021 is on track to double the record breaking number of qualifying events and smash the record number of entries, both

set in 2020.

With various amounts of operational support to Bowls SA, I have also worked extensively in the coaching space alongside Isaac and Tom, which has included presenting at Coach Development Days and delivering various coaching courses, including Introductory and Club Coaches.

As part of my role, I have spent a considerable amount of time on the road, both with events and with club visitations. I wish to wholeheartedly thank the clubs and the members for their unwavering support and hospitality across this past year.
