A word from the president

At the time of writing my message for the annual report, it was heartening to watch our national teams on the world stage in action at the Commonwealth Games with valuable exposure and particularly the para athletes showing how much bowls is a sport for all abilities.

The timing of the games is significant given recent developments. World Bowls, having recently undergone an extensive organisational review, is relocating its headquarters to Australia with former Bowls Australia CEO, Neil Dalrymple named as World Bowls CEO. Make no mistake, the tectonic plates have shifted!

Bowls SA too has recently completed a detailed forensic organisational review of our business highlighting how much has changed since the last review. Taryn Sexton was recruited to do the review and highlighted 65 recommendations to bring Bowls SA to a level considered current 'best practice' and legislatively compliant for a not-for-profit sport governing body and to a level not seen before for Bowls SA.

With the review now coupled with a dynamic 3-year strategic plan, strongly and deliberately aligned with Bowls Australia, lawn bowls in South Australia remains relevant and firmly cemented as a leader in a high participation sport.

The Bowls SA 2022-2025 Strategic Plan was developed in consultation with the membership and I am delighted that such a high level of consultation took place to achieve the outcome. Bowls SA is committed to greater interaction with member Associations and clubs to ensure they remain strong, viable and properly supported in every aspect of the game both on-green and off.

What delights me even more is that on the cusp of her contract with Bowls SA expiring, Taryn agreed to the role of CEO of Bowls SA. Taryn's extensive experience in the not-for-profit membership environment and her demonstrated ability to already develop rapport with Bowls Australia, member clubs, the members and outside agencies, I am confident Bowls SA enters a period of noticeable change to benefit each and every member.

The board of Bowls SA is embracing the change and determined that the immediate future of bowls is a truly collaborative and positive partnership. Our board committees have never been stronger and I believe it appropriate to acknowledge and thank nonboard members for their time and commitment.

At the commencement of 2021, Bowls SA set its marketing and media projects which included key areas and targets to ensure growth of the sport in both participation and branding in this State. In a year of dynamics brought about by COVID it remained imperative too that we continue to harness the value of our members to Bowls SA and to personalise our communication to them.

Amongst the overall marketing activities were: In the year, we have provided a consistent amount of information through the Bowls SA digital and social media platforms exceeding our target numbers of followers and likes on Facebook and followers on Instagram.

Upgrading and improving live streaming of events saw the creation of an optimum live stream rink set up to ensure staff optimise branding opportunities whilst providing an enjoyable product.

A new segment for the promotion the SA Super League was introduced onto the Bowls SA website to enable League franchises to promote themselves or to link their club websites to that of Bowls SA.

We ensured that clubs became aware of the Bowls Australia Local Legends Wanted marketing collateral which has resulted in some excellent articles from our members for insertion into The Bowler.

In March 2022 a workplan was drafted for a new Marketing and Communication Plan with the goals of achieving predictable, consistent, simple and clear communications with the membership with active promotion of the services Bowls SA can provide to clubs and the SA community.

By June 2022, the Bowls SA Annual Member Satisfaction Survey was implemented to provide benchmarking and improvement comparisons, whilst moving the organisation closer to being a truly membercentric body.






