I am pleased to present this report to the membership as a part of the 2022/23 Bowls SA annual report.

The Bowls SA Strategic Plan 2022-2025 developed in partnership with Bowls Australia is for enhanced collaboration and the growth of bowls in South Australia.

The strategic priorities are:

SEE IT - PLAY IT - SUPPORT IT.

The Board together with our valued committees, colleagues at Bowls Australia and in other states, we have worked hard on delivering several elements of our connected Strategic Plan.

SEE IT:

We adopted a Marketing and Communications Strategy, launched new branding for our Night Owls competition and our State Events, live-streamed Champions Week and continued to build our social media base and metrics. We also conducted evidence-based psychographic segmentation research and shared this with clubs to assist them with strategies to attract new members. Nationally, a Diversity and Inclusion Strategy was launched to ensure we are welcoming to all people.

SUPPORT IT:

A Club Development Strategy was adopted and continues to be implemented. Highlights include the

introduction of the Club Connect newsletter aimed at Club Administrators, improved policies and web resources for clubs, and a new model club constitution.

We also held the well-received Club Connect conference, with recorded sessions available to members. Internally, financial, risk and governance practices were greatly improved as the 2021 Review recommendations were implemented.

PLAY IT:

A Pathways document to outline the pathway from first time bowler to Jackaroo was completed.

The Game and Season Format Committee is acutely aware that changes need to be made and continues to work on enhancing participation opportunities at all levels.

On that note, congratulations to all bowlers who were selected to represent South Australia in U18, Opens, O60's, and Para at Nationals this year, after a 2 year break due to COVID. Well done also to all those who participated in our state events and congratulations to those who were successful in winning medals or shields while representing.

As you know, our sport does not function without the selfless work of our volunteers, and I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of the hard-working members of Bowls SA committees, Umpires, Coaches, Selectors and club administrators. Bowls SA could not operate without their tireless efforts, so thank you sincerely for your service.

The board acknowledges the sponsors of our various events, without whom it would be difficult to continue the number of events open to the bowls community currently throughout the state.

Throughout the year I was privileged to have been invited to a number of club centenary celebrations to celebrate their milestones with club members.

The year ending 30 June 2023 saw a huge volume of work performed by our small and dedicated team in the office, and on your behalf, I thank the staff for their resilience, unwavering dedication, and passion for our sport.

We do what we say we will do, when we say we will do it.

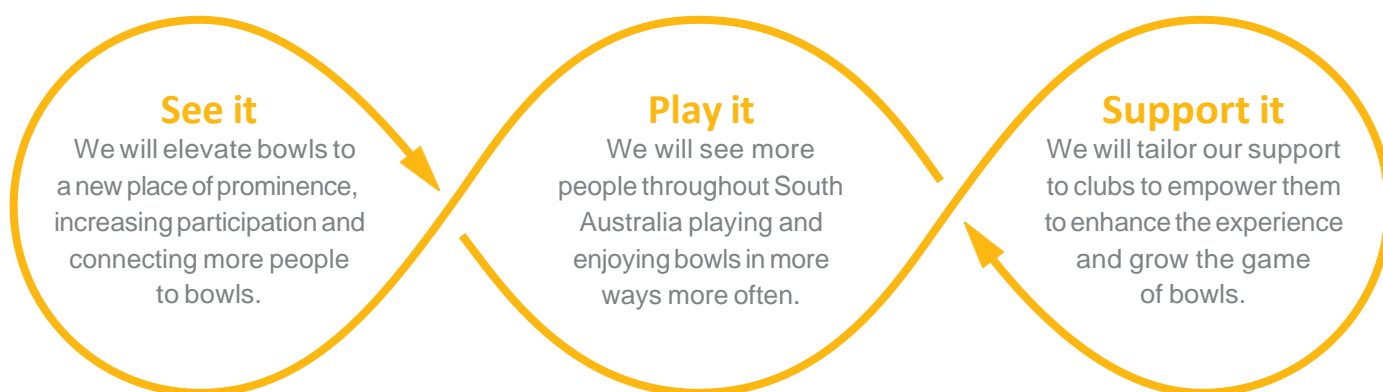
Respect:

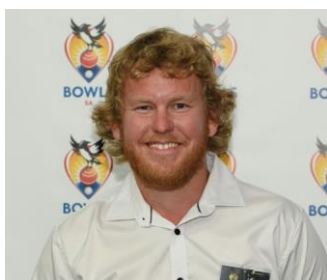

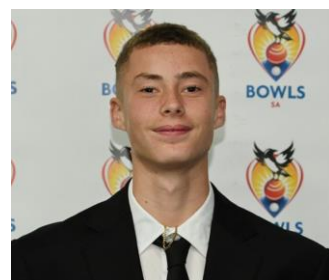

Firstly, I must acknowledge the work of the committee and their visions for a better and more easily navigated future for bowls along with the support of Bowls SA staff.

The goal being a constitution that manages our Bowls SA Association and a set of By-Laws that manage our competitions.

Following a review of our Constitution last year, saw the removal of the restrictions on board members being part of their local Associations. The reviewed By-Laws made it now possible for casual and social members to participate in member clubs' local tournaments/carnivals, as a way of introducing these players into the game.

Risk assessment and management of same was undertaken by the committee along with other Bowls SA committees, staff and board members.

Leading to a new model constitution for member clubs to adapt & complement the new Bowls SA constitution, which has been well received.

Still to come is a revamped model constitution for Associations.

Discussions on the inclement weather policy took place, resulting in a policy for State Events and a separate policy for pennants etc being approved by the Board for the past season, with a further review to take place prior to next bowls season.

During our committee discussions it came to light that clubs with active ABN's need to complete the online review as of 1 July 2023. This was subsequently then communicated to all clubs.

The challenges faced by clubs today have never been greater with how to increase membership numbers being at the forefront however I do not believe that any one suggestion may suit all clubs.

The Finance, Risk and Audit Committee oversaw several key projects this year, including the introduction of a new, significantly smaller Chart of Accounts, a move from MYOB accounting package to Xero and with it, improved reporting and budgetary practices. Many key policies were adopted including an Instrument of Delegation, Treasury Policy, Internal Controls and a Business Continuity Plan.

Together with the Governance Committee, a Risk Management Policy and Risk Register was also developed and subsequently adopted by the Board. Ongoing work on the long term budget and business model of bowls, including management of the investment portfolio was also undertaken by the committee.

The State Event Committee has had an active year with meetings conducted regularly, some using ZOOM.

As Chair of the Committee, comprising of fellow members, Wayne Lee, Sandy Wallace (Board Member), Jackie Field, Steve Franks (representing MBA), Ian James, Raelene Heitmann and Bowls SA staff Isaac Trenorden, we have been engaged in improving our State Events and the Conditions of Play associated with these Events based upon feedback received from players, Regional State Event Managers and Associations, alike.

Preparing a State Event Calendar is a challenge with many factors impinging upon the timing of certain State Events e.g., National Events. In addition, the impact of the State Event Calendar upon our local clubs, their members, and their scheduled tournaments must also be considered.

For these reasons, the State Event Calendar continues to be tweaked from one season to the next as the Committee strives to deliver the most appropriate State Event schedule for all participating bowlers.

As an example, certain State Events were repositioned to different times in the season in an endeavour to maximise the number of participants for not just these State Events but across all State Events.

Looking at the 2022-2023 season, a total of 1,264 entries were received for the various State Events, a 2.2% increase in entries from the previous season. Country Regions contribution being 56% of the total entries received.

Freeing up weekends to assist clubs is also an acknowledged consideration to ensure that clubs can remain financially viable.

The National Officiating Accreditation Scheme adopted in 14/15 has been a huge success and has bought a consistency within officiating throughout the state and indeed the nation. There are many officials within the state still requiring reaccreditation, these will automatically roll over until we have the opportunity to conduct the courses. Unfortunately due to a range of unforeseen circumstances, the unavailability of members from the officiating committee, the lack of time required, our intent to get out into the country associations to assess Presenters and Assessors was not able to be fulfilled.

I would like to commit to the Officiators of the state that this will be a priority in the coming season. To ensure we continue to maintain a high standard it is essential that presenters and assessors are also assessed. We are also looking for current umpires to consider taking on the role as a Presenter and Assessor, I can assure you this is an extremely rewarding position to have, knowing you are

endeavouring to continue to educate, inform and train our future officials.

To Joan Prosser, Di Milner, Vic Culbertson, Brian Leckie, and our latest members of the team in Ian Graetz and Rob McKeown who have all contributed to holding courses and assisting in numerous ways, a huge thank you for your time and dedication to this and your involvement within the group, along with your efforts have been greatly appreciated.

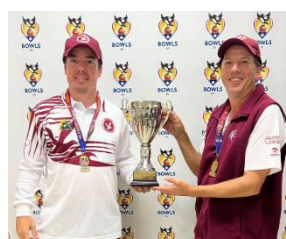

The Nationals

The Nationals wrapped up for 2022 with a strong week of representation from our South Australian team at Broadbeach Bowls Club in Queensland.

The Under 18s were bursting to get out of the blocks after no competition since 2020. The thrill of playing in the nationals competition saw the girls pairs doing just that, knocking over NSW in their first game by a considerable 23-11. Our teams finished strong and saw the girls' pairs playing off for Gold and the boys' singles playing off for Bronze. In some of the worst weather for the week, they pushed through the rain collecting silver and bronze.

The Mutli-Disability team also got in on the action with their events at Club Mermaid. For the first time this side represented South Australia and Bowls SA, with the competition run by Bowls Australia.

The Over 60s stepped onto the national stage with Bowls Australia running this event for the first time. Our Ladies got off to a great start by knocking over Tasmania under lights in their bid at the Betty Collins OAM Trophy. The ladies lost just a couple of very close games, which saw them finish third, just 2 wins short of second place.

The men fought hard, earning 5 wins and 1 loss going into their final game against Victoria who also sat with 5 wins and 1 loss, meaning the winners of the game would claim the John Debbie AM Trophy. The Men took a loss to Queensland in round one but rallied and came out firing in game two, knocking over Victoria. The Men were looking to add to our two Alley Shields but fell two wins short of first place and a mere 2.5 points short of second to finish in third place.

That completed our positive South Australian representative sides campaigns for the 2022 year.

As part of an audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Association's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Board.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Board's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Association's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial report or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up

to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.

- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with the Board of the Association regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
